To all to whom these presents shall come greeting in Everlasting Memory Know ye that I Jeffrey Wyatt Lt Governour and Capt Governour of Virginia by vertue of the great Charter of Orders and Statutes considered in a Generall Quarter Court by the Honorable Comissioners and Company of Adventurers for the first Plantation of Virginia according to the authorities granted them by his Majesty under his great seals and by them dated at London the Eighteenth day of November one thousand six hundred and eighteenth and directed to the Honorable Comission of State his Majesty are joyntly in Commission with me give and grant unto Edward Waters of Elizabeth City gent unto his heirs and assigns forever for his first voyage to be enjoyed and continued by the Company to have his said heirs or assigns who hee or they shall see sufficiently hereunto inclined and pleased the same one hundred acres of Land situate lying and being on the edge of the forrest about two miles below Blunt point abutting Eastward upon a Creeke commonly called by his name waters Waters Creeke Westward upon the Land of Persival Gbbison Northward upon the forrest and South upon the great river (the said one hundred acres being in the right of his transporters out of England at his own cost of two servants (vizt) Edward Bryan who came in the Bona Nova 1620 and William Arnall who came in the Sea Flower 1621 whose passage hee defrayed to Mr Thomas Munier (to have and to hold the said one hundred acres of Land with the appurtenances and with the one share of all Mines and Minerals therein containing and with all rights and priviledges of hunting fishing fowling and other within the limits and upon the borders of the same unto the sole and proper use benefit and behoofe of him the said Edward Waters his heirs and assigns forever in as large and ample manner to all intents and purposes as is expressed in the said great Charter or by whatsoever may be justly collected out of the same or out of his Majesty's Letters patents whereon it is grounded. You being under paying unto the said Adventurers Company unto their Company for three years at the feast of St Michael the
